

Thought for Today

Today many people may not be aware that on Candlemas we celebrate an ancient feast, common to the Church of both East and West, which used to have a great significance in the rural calendar. It has pagan origins and is that time of the year which naturally forms a transition period in winter, for Candlemas comes halfway between the winter solstice and the spring equinox.

In the Christian calendar, from at least 543, it became a festival set aside to commemorate the presentation of Jesus in the Temple of Jerusalem. In the reading Simeon calls Jesus "a light to enlighten the Gentiles". Accordingly this day was made into a feast of candles. Yet for many it is the 'bitter-sweet' nature of what it celebrates which is most meaningful. The child is greeted by Simeon and Anna with rejoicing yet the prophetic words of Simeon, which speak of the falling and rising of many and the sword that will pierce, lead on to the passion and to Easter. These words make Candlemas a kind of pivot in the Christian year. At the end of the Service we take one last look back to Christmas, and then turn towards the cross.
