Bless our nation as we mourn her death and may her example continue to inspire us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

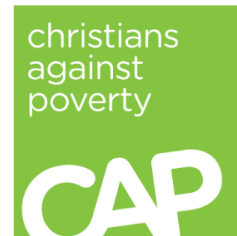
Thought for Today

Christians Against Poverty

There are 14 million people living in poverty in the UK, that's more than the combined population of Newcastle, London, Glasgow and Manchester! Bells The bells were rung 'open' (i.e. unmuffled) on Saturday 10th September to mark the accession of King Charles III. From then they will be rung muffled until after the funeral. On the day of the funeral we shall be ringing from 10.00am to 11.0am. In line with tradition the backstroke of the tenor bell is left unmuffled in order to produce a steady, rhythmic sound which emulates the tolling of a funeral bell. *Paul Cross (Tower Captain)*

All Saints East Window A lump of stone has fallen from one of the stone mullions on the east window. There were fissures in the stone before, but it is possible that Storm Arwen caused some movement causing the stone to split and fall. A claim was submitted to our insurers, but this was rejected due to the known presence of the fissures in the stone.

Our church architect, Ian Ness, was asked for advice and the solution is to temporarily remove part of the stained glass and fit new stone sections secured with stainless steel rods. The window will need to be scaffolded inside and out so the opportunity will be taken to clean the glass on the inside, quite possibly for the first time ever! Quotations have been sought and the cost of the work, including professional fees, will be £16,775 including VAT of £2,485, though some of the VAT should be recoverable.

The repairs need to be carried out as soon as possible and the PCC has authorised orders to be placed and for a Faculty to be sought. Contributions to the cost will be most welcome.

Northumbria Deaf Church Mission of the Month – September 2022

We are very grateful to All Saints for allowing us to be one of this year's Missions of the Month, and we appreciate any donations that may help us to continue the work that we are doing. Post Covid re-establishment of our usual activities is picking up now, although some of the faithful church service attendees have passed away, and their loss is felt deeply by all. Canon Glyn Evans is an enthusiastic chaplain for deaf people, whose skills in British Sign Language enable him to get to know his parishioners, and understand their needs. He's held in high regard by deaf people who appreciate his ability to sign to them.

The main purpose of the Deaf Church is to provide access to church services and activities to deaf people in their own language – British Sign Language. We hope to increase awareness of Christian faith, in a friendly and accessible environment, which is what most parishes are about. BSL is the only difference.

In addition, we recognise the loneliness and isolation of many deaf people whose families, employers, or people from organisations such as public health services **can't or won't use sign language**. This leads to frustration, anger, and despair that society treats deaf people very differently from hearing people.

We arrange activities such as coffee mornings, walks with pub lunches, craft groups and visits to enable people to meet up in a friendly BSL environment.

This does all make a difference to so many people, and the feedback on Facebook as well as in person indicates that we are fulfilling a desperate need to socialise and to feel included in society.
