Thought for today

God calls us to be more humane.

Just how much compassion and forgiveness are we required to give? Today we hear that it is endless! One of the most moving experiences in life is to encounter a person who has every reason for being bitter and vengeful but refuses to be either. Instead they remain generous, forgiving and accepting. As followers of Jesus Christ we have been taught that forgiveness and the seeking of reconciliation are a high priority. We all get hurt by others. We can use up great quantities of energy just coping with resentments which pop up into our minds at unexpected moments. Jesus says that we can move forward when we realise we are the debtor who owes so much. He teaches us that reconciliation is a process we can initiate. He tells us that if someone hurts us we are not to wait for them to come and say that they are sorry; we are to go to that person, point (gently and carefully) to the difficulty and try to begin the work of reconciliation. This is not easy but then doing the right thing is often an act of will.

Donating to All Saints. We are keeping a very close eye on the cost of running All Saints and have cut back on much spending, to minimise the impact on the budget set for the year. If you normally give to the church via the collection plate, you can make a one-off donation in the same place. All contributions are very gratefully received since we have lost several of our regular income streams owing to the cancellation of weddings and the closure of the Parish Centre.

Mission of the Month. Each month any plate donations from our services are given to a nominated charity. We ask members of the congregation to consider putting away money and later giving to the **Northumbria Deaf Church**, based at St Andrew's Church, Newgate Street, supporting services for deaf people in Northumbria and Durham by providing Lay Pastoral Assistants fluent in sign language

Northumbria Deaf Church 2020

Everyone at Northumbria Deaf Church is very grateful that we are Mission of the Month at All Saints' for the month of September, and we'd like to thank Chris Matthews and the committee for selecting us this year. As with all of the other chosen MoMs, it helps us to raise awareness of who we are, and what we aim to do, as well as to try to raise funds for the day to day running costs, such as renting space at St Andrew's in Newgate Street, where we are based, paying for our 3 part time employees, and supporting the projects which bring deaf people together in a friendly environment.

We hold a regular coffee morning on Thursdays, which has been a fixture for as long as I have known the Mission (as it was formerly known). This attracts people from a wide area of the north east, and for many is their only opportunity of seeing other deaf friends, being able to communicate in their own language, and take their minds off some of the stresses brought by being deaf in a hearing world.

There is a lively craft group, which is often focussed on raising money for other causes with the sale of their handiwork.

The walking group visits various coastal, city and countryside spots to walk together, discovering new places and of course finding cafes en route.

There is a monthly signed service, where the deaf parishioners are encouraged to sign the readings, perhaps a prayer, and the deaf choir signs hymns. This is followed by tea or coffee in the church hall. There is a similar group in Newton Aycliffe, where they meet every month for a church service, followed by refreshments, bingo and a raffle.

You may have noticed that I have used the present tense so far, which implies that all of the above are ongoing activities, but of course Covid has had its devastating effect on our ability to meet up for any reason so far.

Two of our three part time staff are on furlough, as all of our activities had to stop in March. We are now trying to explore ways in which we can restart differently, and hope that we may find ways soon to resume activities deemed to be safe. There are elderly and vulnerable people within the deaf community who are too frightened to leave their homes at the moment.

But this is where technology has been such a blessing. People can chat in BSL on Facetime, Zoom, connect on WhatsApp, share jokes, and make sure that people are managing. Our newest employee, Vikki, is young, tech savvy, brimming with ideas, and is keeping our Facebook page running so that people can keep up to date.

Peter and I, like so many other parishioners at All Saints, have been so grateful to have had the opportunity to view a video service each week, seeing familiar faces and hearing familiar words which helped us all to remain connected. It was after watching one of these videos that I thought that we ought to do a signed video service for our deaf congregation. Beverley gave me advice on how to do it, and how to put it all together, so I duly made note – then asked Vikki if she'd take charge. It took longer than we expected, as we wanted to involve as many people as possible, but at last we had a BSL service that we've been able to share widely, which has been much appreciated. It's not as professional looking as the All Saints videos, and we didn't include sound or subtitles, (not needed if your language is BSL) but we're hoping to do another one this month, and will see how we can improve the end product.

One final word – as there is no sound on the video, and no words to read, this reverses the experience of deaf people who attend a service for hearing people, where they can't hear what is being said, and would struggle with the written language of a prayer book. I do hope that some of you will give it a try.


